Why Genesis Matters

Genesis 2:1-3 Thus the heavens and the earth were finished, and all the host of them. And on the seventh day God finished his work that he had done, and he rested on the seventh day from all his work that he had done. So God blessed the seventh day and made it holy, because on it God rested from all his work that he had done in creation.

I recently attended the Rocky Mountain District's



Spring Pastor's Conference in Estes Park. Our presenter was Dr. Andrew Steinmann who has written extensively for our Synod in commentaries, history articles, and a book about the chronology present in the Bible. He is one of a small handful of expert scholars who know the original languages of the Bible, the cultural languages of the times, and archaeological history. He is a world-renowned scholar who was instrumental in moving the death date of King Herod the Great acknowledging that Jesus was most likely born in the fall of 3 B.C. or the spring of 2 B.C. corroborating all the Biblical evidence we have of Jesus' life in the Scriptures. He knows his Bible, his history, and his theology very well.

Our topic was the theology and chronology of the book of Genesis. So often, non-Biblical churches want to mix evolutionary old earth theories with Scripture to harmonize the Bible and contemporary science. They reason to misinterpret words and context from Scripture or spiritualize historic contexts to make God the God of evolution rather than creation.

Ultimately, if you believe, like we do, that the Scriptures are correct and the words mean what they say, then the whole book of Genesis, and even the Pentateuch, really describes a very young earth, from 6000 years old to at the very largest outset, 20,000 years old!

But why does this matter? The Word of God is at stake! If you interpret Genesis loosely, with no clear grammatical or historical background, you will have to also apply those same rubrics (which are not scholarly at all) to the rest of Scripture. And if Scripture doesn't mean what it says, then the Gospel is at stake with Jesus' death and resurrection not being true!

But if Genesis is true, and the Gospels are true by the same Scripture, then we have a solid and certain

hope in the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ! I hope that in the next few years, Holy Cross will be able to invite the Denver Creation Society to have special speakers who show us the marvels of God's creation in science and how science always points to the veracity of Scripture, and the hope we have in Christ. More to come about this after summer.



Community Garden Welcome to the 2024 year of Gardening!

1. Garden Cleanup Day | May 4th | 9:30 to noon: This will include trash clean up, bringing up tarps and stakes, checking the fence and posts, setting out hoses, cleaning up around the barn, and renumbering of the beds.

2. The code to the garden is the same, and if you are keeping your beds, please stop by the Church to fill out the usual **paperwork and pay fees.** 1 bed = \$15; 2 beds (1/2 plot)= \$30; whole plot (4 beds)= \$60. Please use the west entrance if you want to clean out your beds. The school is still in session, and for the safety of the children during the day we use that side.

3. Water has been scheduled to be turned on around the **15th of May**. (This will depend on any repairs that might be needed.)

4. I have not requested free plants this year. I did get a request in for seeds but have not heard back about them yet. There are still bags of fertilizer in the barn. We will try to purchase more in a few weeks.

5. There is a project for an Eagle Scout planned this year. The dates are not set yet. He is going to build us some self-watering beds for disabled members. If this design works well, we may look into building more self-watering beds in the future. This will allow gardeners to not water every day once plants are established. It will also save on our watering bill for the Church.
