

September at a Glance

Check out what's happening in worship, growth, service, and community at Holy Cross this month.

Healing, Unity, and Worship

"What then, brothers? When you come together, each one has a hymn, a lesson, a revelation, a tongue, or an interpretation. Let all things be done for building up... But all things should be done decently and in order." 1 Corinthians 14:26, 40

Thank you to all who participated in our Worship Survey and our small group listening posts. The data we received from the Survey was very good and many made good comments about our worship services.

Your Elders, the BoLM, first decided to move to one service last Advent because Holy Cross was divided, unhealthy, fractured, and having strife. They decided then that having 3 back-to-back services further divided the congregation and attributed much to the disunity and the strife. Worship moved to one united service with the sheep coming together to worship in united liturgy, song, preaching, and especially Communion especially Communion. When you interviewed me, even before I accepted the Call, I was very straightforward in communicating that I would not return Holy Cross to 3 back-to-back services and I would implement a dedicated Education/Fellowship time for all the congregation to participate.

After I accepted the Call, it became very evident to your Elders that having one service, one Bible study and one pastor garnered unity and health. Those who have participated in our worship, my Bible study, and especially the Sacrament of the Altar at these times have found refreshment and a renewed sense of health and unity. Your Elders then began the first deliberation to see if summer was a good time to move to a two-service format. They found that there was still some disharmony, and the congregation wasn't quite ready yet.

The Worship Survey was specifically crafted to get data on key factors of moving to two worship services. There were 300 participants with many of them also adding additional comments. Your Elders and I sifted through all the data and comments to find trends of health or hurt. In some ways, Holy Cross is not quite ready to move to two services right now. There are some sheep in our congregation that are a little myopic in looking to their wants rather than their needs or to the love of their neighbor. There are, though, many sheep who are on the right track of healing and unity. I, as your pastor, want to reiterate that in worship services here at Holy Cross, Word and Sacrament ministry is essential with good liturgy, sound music, and solid preaching/teaching all centered on the forgiveness we now have in Jesus' death and resurrection. When moving to two services we will be highlighting that every sheep at Holy Cross, whether you like early or late services, should come to fellowship and Bible study together. So often congregation member sheep set their worship standards based on time and style. I would like you to consider worshiping, learning, and fellowshipping regularly with each other as a new standard of health and unity.

The good news I would like to share with you is that the BoLM, your Elders, have decided that **Sunday**, **Nov. 3**, **All Saints Day Observed** will be the day we move to two worship services. At **8 a.m.** there will be an early service with hymnal liturgy and hymns. At **11 a.m.** there will be a service with Creative Worship liturgy and the Praise Team. Between those services, we will have a dedicated fellowship and education time that is *still being finalized* to best serve the congregation and servant volunteers. More will be announced on this later. We will also be planning one joint worship service throughout the year to continue to build unity and fellowship here at Holy Cross.

Please prioritize coming to worship before the switch to better connect with your fellow sheep here at Holy Cross who might be moving to a different worship time than you in the future. Please also prioritize fellowship and adult Bible study together here at Holy Cross so we may all be traveling in the direction of Jesus Christ our Good Shepherd.




