Godly Voting

Pastor Z is not going to tell you for whom or what to vote, but he will give you some advice for how to make Godly decisions when you are voting.

2 Kings 21:1-2, 9 "Manasseh was twelve years old when he began to reign, and he reigned fiftyfive years in Jerusalem. His mother's name was Hephzibah. ² And he did what was evil in the sight of the Lord, according to the despicable practices of the nations whom the Lord drove out before the people of Israel... ⁹ But they did not listen, and Manasseh led them astray to do more evil than the nations had done whom the Lord destroyed before the people of Israel."

Speaking and Silent

In the last few years there has been a lot written and spoken concerning how a Christian should be politically involved as an individual or in a church body. On one hand, it is abundantly clear that Church (your congregation) is a mouthpiece of the Gospel of Jesus Christ and God's Word. Our priority is sin and forgiveness in Christ, not politics! However, God's Word does show us, especially with the third use of the Law (guide) how we are supposed to live and vote. A congregation is not a political platform, so we Lutherans should never endorse one candidate or party over another, but the pastor or the congregation should speak God's Law and Gospel so that it might be directly applied to the political sins of our nation and its people. It is a fine line to walk but a necessary distinction and application of Law and Gospel in our country today.

Political Problem

Every election year, there is an escalation of wickedness in our American politics. Where once it was just verbal mudslinging, it has now risen to extreme party polarization, polling manipulation, assassination attempts, and loss of rights under the Constitution. In my lifetime, parties and professionals in politics have rapidly degenerated. I have had many Christians ask me how we as Christians are supposed to vote for certain legislature and candidates. There is somewhat of a sliding scale of civil righteousness in most candidates and

legislation that makes it difficult to easily decide. However, I have found some rules of thumb that can help a Christian vote better.

Gift of Political Freedom

Christians in the United States are given an exceedingly great gift of our freedoms and democracy. Many of our brothers and sisters in other nations around the world get no say in how they are governed. I strongly urge all Christians to vote using God's Word to effect change in our nation and world.

Two Kingdoms

It is also important to note that our country is not a theocracy but a worldly democracy. We are not parallel with the kingdom of Israel the Old Testament. Christians live in two Kingdoms today, the Kingdom of the Right (righteous in Christ) and the Kingdom of the Left (civil worldly states). Christians living in the Kingdom of the Right are scattered throughout the world in various Kingdoms of the Left. We can effect Godly change in our countries, but we must realize our ultimate citizenship is in heaven, our King is Jesus, and we live by His Word personally even if our country does not.

First and Foremost

One difficulty for some Christians is to acknowledge that we are bound as slaves of Christ to live our lives, vote, and promote God's Word, especially the 10 Commandments and the Gospel of Jesus Christ (Law and Gospel). There are many American Christians, even Lutherans, who have compartmentalized their beliefs to vote in opposition to God's Word. People don't know God's Word, so they vote for whatever pleases them rather than through Christian discernment upholding God's Word. Sometimes American Christians are just caught up in the sinful struggle of knowing what we should be doing in voting but succumbing to the sinful desires of our flesh and society. The second table of the Law is a great guideline as to how we should love our neighbor personally and as a nation. This also gives us a sense of prioritization as the 5th Commandment has a greater prioritization over the 7th Commandment. One commandment is before another, and one commandment flows to another making prioritization a little easier to view.

Salvation and Vocation

We must also be aware that for all political candidates who confess Christ (claim Christianity) there is a distinction between their personal belief/practice of righteousness in Christ and their vocation of leading people. We would hope that a Christian candidate would live, lead, and vote according to God's Word, but as with all sinful people, there will be problems of daily living in Christ's righteousness. We must separate issues of personal sin and salvation and then focus on their vocation of leader which in some cases might not reflect their personal belief or religion.

Enforce, Promote, Ambivalent

There is a spectrum of whether a political candidate wants to enforce, promote, or be ambivalent to righteousness or wickedness. Does a candidate want to enforce righteousness in our laws? (This is rare but could happen in something like a Godly marriage law.) Do they want to promote righteousness? (This can happen more often and are usually boundary laws for stealing, adultery, etc. Removing or minimizing a sinful option can also fall under this category.) Are they ambivalent, letting people do their own way? (This is many times a libertarian approach but often sinful people in mass can do horrendously sinful things so complete ambivalence can be detrimental. Hence why we have legislature in the first place.) Do they promote wickedness? (A good example is a candidate that is in favor of killing children in abortion because of some philosophy they have.) Or in the worst case, do they want to enforce wickedness? (This is the case when the governing authorities want to force you to disobey God. It is rare but can happen as with the Apostles and the Sanhedrin in Acts.) As our above Scripture gives an example, the law is designed to curb wickedness, so we are to be especially wary of candidates or laws that promote or enforce wickedness as sin can become very rampant in our society.

Verify, Verify, Verify

Our country is in a sad state where a person can no longer trust elected leaders, media, or even valued parties. A good citizen of both the Right and Left Kingdoms will have to verify what is said about legislation or a candidate. Legislative writing can be confusing as it might be written in the negative about something positive or vice versa. Candidates and parties can misdirect questions or difficulties with their platforms and agendas. However, there are a lot of good resources out there for Christians to hear how candidates speak, and how legislation is written from a Word perspective. None of these are the ultimate definition of candidates and legislation (trust then verify) but together they can help paint a truer picture. Be sure to read their questions and answers carefully to get a clearer picture of how a candidate or legislature ranks in comparison to the above discussion. I especially like www.Christianvoterguide.com, www.ivoterguide.com, and things from the American Family Association. And in the end, take a little more time to verify again so that you are as close to the truth about the issues as possible.

Candidate Application

Take a presidential candidate for example, after removing their past sins and their personal belief, when they speak about their agendas are they enforcing or promoting wickedness against what God's Word says? Are they just ambivalent? Do they promote or even want to enforce righteousness according to God's Word? I usually look at the first part of the second table of the Law (4, 5, and 6) and see how well the candidate promotes or enforces wickedness or righteousness. According to this litmus test a good candidate usually rises to the top and poor ones will sink to the bottom.

Legislative Application

Take the topic of abortion, especially with the current proposed legislation of Colorado Amendment 79. It doesn't seem that this proposed legislation wants to enforce wickedness, but it does want to promote wickedness in our state by allowing more abortions (5th Commandment issues) rather than trying to restrain them. When a Christian uses God's Word through the above consideration it makes seemingly grey politics more black and white.

With All Else Being Equal

When using God's Word to help define how we vote, there are many candidates and legislature that fall out of our voting freedom and some rise to the top. However, there might be a few candidates or pieces of legislature that move into the realm of wisdom or best practice. I then try to look at the consequences (intended or unintended) of legislation or the spoken/written agendas of candidates. Usually, one or another rises above the rest. And finally, when all else is equal, I reach out to the Body of Christ to seek their wisdom in voting and their perspective on these matters. Try also praying for the Holy Spirit to remind you of God's Word when you go into the voting booth!

Elect to Elect

God has chosen and elected you in Christ by His Grace and Will to live in this time and place. We have a joy to be involved in our government process and a Christian duty to vote and act according to God's Word for the furtherance of the Gospel of Jesus Christ. So, please go out and vote accordingly!
