Worship Changes

¹⁹Therefore, brothers, since we have confidence to enter the holy places by the blood of Jesus, ²⁰by the new and living way that he opened for us through the curtain, that is, through his flesh, ²¹and since we have a great priest over the house of God, ²²let us draw near with a true heart in full assurance of faith, with our hearts sprinkled clean from an evil conscience and our bodies washed with pure water. ²³Let us hold fast the confession of our hope without wavering, for he who promised is faithful. ²⁴And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, ²⁵not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near. Hebrews 10:19-25

Two Worship Services

It is a time of change at Holy Cross. Some have long anticipated that we will return to multiple worship services. For some, the change is difficult as they have enjoyed having only one worship service. And for others, just the thought of change causes anxiety. I was asked to explain a little of the BoLM's (your Elders) reasoning as to why we are moving to this change in worship and possibly not to other ideas about worship. I was also asked to anticipate reasons or difficulties that might prompt further changes in worship here at Holy Cross.

Trauma and Suffering

Starting even before COVID in 2020 Holy Cross had already begun to suffer what I call "trauma." There was a noticeable decline in weekly worship attendance, unity, and stewardship at Holy Cross. Then during COVID, people at Holy Cross felt out of control, some were sin-sick, and others were deeply hurt by changes placed upon them. I won't go into great detail about this, but it bears mentioning as it is a benchmark of the changes we now face today at Holy Cross. This trauma extended a few years after that as worship attendance, stewardship, and unity continued to decline to where we are today nearly half the size of the congregation as we once were before COVID. Then the congregation had an interim and Calling period, a period of rest before things might change with a new pastor, rescheduled worship, and rediscovering our identity as Christians, Lutherans, and people of Holy Cross. At the beginning of my Call here at Holy Cross, I specifically held a Bible study on Shepherd and Sheep to get members to lovingly talk about how the trauma had affected them, how they might have been hurt by others, or even hurt others during this trauma. Just by processing our trauma, we can better adapt to the changes we face today as a congregation.

Indicators of Trauma

Even before I accepted the Call to Holy Cross, most of its members recognized the difficulties that Holy Cross had been through and with which it was still struggling. The Transition Team document was a great thermometer to gauge the health of the congregation as a whole and its individual members. After asking many questions to your leadership, members, Circuit pastors, District leaders, interim pastor, and many others, I began to get a clearer picture of issues and complications. One apparent indicator of trauma was that Holy Cross was used to a very busy Sunday and weekly life and yet these activities were causing sheep to be scattered rather than united in Word and Sacrament. With the already present decline in worship attendance and the seeming restart after COVID, congregation members wanted a lot of activity, but they were not united. It also came to my attention that many people have not ever had the opportunity of a Pastor led Bible study on Sunday morning because the worship schedule was so busy. Then on top of all this, there were varied opinions as to which style of worship should be and when. For some, there was the attitude of "my way is the only way" with little thought of what is best in worship and who all else is served in worship. Your Elders made the difficult decision to go to one worship service to promote unity and healing. And they wrestled with this decision all throughout the year to see if Holy Cross, as individual members and as a whole, was ready to go back to multiple worship services. Even before I became your pastor, I gauged that it was not good, right, and salutary to go back to the old ways of worship but to give opportunity for growth in the foundation of God's Word in a dedicated education hour for all members. In May, the Elders were still hesitant to return to two services but with the help of the Worship Survey, we were glad to move to 2 worship services in November.

Worship Survey

It is important to note that the Worship Survey is not a democratic vote as to what the majority of people want and then go along with the mass decision. It was called and designed as a survey to gather opinions about many things, give direction as to what could and could not be, and then gauge the spiritual temperature of the congregation. It asked style questions but reassured us that liturgy would still be present. It tried to narrow down what times would work best while not giving poor freedom to scatter the congregation further. The Elders discussed closely the Survey results and comments. One important decision the Elders made was that even if the majority of the congregation wanted something a certain way, the whole congregation had to have an eye to serving the smaller/weaker group as that is what a family in Christ does. Just because there is a majority doesn't mean we ignore the minority. We are a family here at Holy Cross - a flock - that worships, feasts on Sacraments, and serves our Lord, each other, and our neighbor. Compromises would be made for the sake of the weaker as well as the stronger whole. I was so pleased with the process of the Survey as it did give the NElders great data points and there were multiple avenues to hear from individual congregation members. It allowed us to make a wise decision to go to two worship services in November.

Celebration of Services

And now we are at a time of change once again. We are going to two services that are similar and yet different from what Holy Cross had in the past. The Elders are still looking for ways to better describe and announce our services to help people realize that even though they are similar to the past, they will also be different from what might have been done. We are not reupping the old but establishing the new. The first service, based on overwhelming Survey results, will be at 8 a.m. and will look in many ways like the former Traditional services except it will include all the liturgy from the hymnal because there is no need to cut out parts because of time constraints. The service can celebrate the hymnal, its liturgy, and hymns more fully. Fellowship and gathering to study God's Word will be highlighted for everyone to engage, young and old, and it allows the reestablishing of our foundational beliefs, teachings, confessions, and practices without conflicting with Word and Sacrament worship. The 11 a.m. service will have the Praise Team lead music with Creative Worship liturgy as well as an opportunity to include some hymns throughout the year. There were a lot of people who both liked praise and

worship music as well as traditional hymns, so this compromise was made. Because traditional hymns were appealing to many people across the congregation, we are even scheduling combined blended services throughout the year so that all can continue to enjoy this style of worship.

The New Norm

We celebrate in November two worship services on Sunday mornings that offer opportunities of style, blessings of community together, and growth in our study of God's Word. I look forward to hearing our choirs in both services and to the opportunities for all of us to gather together in combined worship services in the future. We should realize that we are a different congregation than we were just 5 years ago. We can have nostalgia but can't live in it. Holy Cross, as with most families, looks and acts differently than what it once did in the past.

Looking Ahead

One thing to realize, though, is that with changes in worship, there will be some things diminished. With one service we were blessed by having a full sanctuary with congregation members singing, lots of children at the Children's message, worshiping all together and coming to the Sacrament of the Altar, and many people involved with fellowshipping after worship. Two services will change this dynamic slightly. The leadership hopes that having two services will increase our weekly worship attendance and future stewardship so as to have both services full. However, the leaders will be evaluating the two worship services all throughout the year to see if all things are going well or if future tweaks/changes are in order. I would encourage you, as the verse above states, to weekly come to worship - God's divine service to you in Word and Sacrament. That you would engage in the times we all gather together to build unity and fellowship in the congregation. That you and your children all attend education hour here at Holy Cross. And that we continue to stir up one another in Christ our Lord!


