Christmas Gift of Prayer

Philippians 1:18-26 "Yes, and I will rejoice, for I know that through your prayers and the help of the Spirit of Jesus Christ this will turn out for my deliverance, as it is my eager expectation and hope that I will not be at all ashamed, but that with full courage now as always Christ will be honored in my body, whether by life or by death. For to me to live is Christ, and to die is gain. If I am to live in the flesh, that means fruitful labor for me. Yet which I shall choose I cannot tell. I am hard pressed between the two. My desire is to depart and be with Christ, for that is far better. But to remain in the flesh is more necessary on your account. Convinced of this, I know that I will remain and continue with you all, for your progress and joy in the faith, so that in me you may have ample cause to glory in Christ Jesus, because of my coming to you again."

Paul and Prayer

In the Scripture, Paul recognizes the prayers of the saints at Philippi. Normally Paul has prayers for the saints, but here he rejoices that the saints are praying for him. Although Paul's situation is a lot more dire as he fears he will be dying and going to be with the Lord, he rejoices at the opportunity to be with the Christians there. Paul's prayer is answered as he can write the congregation and long to be with them in person.

God's Gifts at Christmas

At Christmas, Christians are always reminded of God the Father's gracious giving nature that He gave us His one and only Son, Jesus Christ, to be born! God is a giver by nature, but He would not entitle us in our sin. He had to take care of our problem of being separated from Him by our sin and that would take His Son, Jesus, to die on the cross as a complete atonement and for Him to rise resurrected as proof of this justification. We now trust in Christ as our Savior and God the Father treats us 100% as His beloved children, just like Jesus Christ! On top of all these gifts that we might celebrate at Christmas, we also marvel at the gift of prayer that He gives us. We, His children, can come to Him at any time in prayer knowing that our Father graciously listens to us and answers our prayers according to His good and gracious will!

The Gift of Answered and Unanswered Prayer

As many of you have experienced in your own lives, God answers prayers! But praying as a child of God is not like ordering something from Amazon or getting something out of a vending machine. We ask God for our needs, wants, and desires in prayer but our Father sometimes has a different view and will than ours. He says for us to ask Him in prayer, to expect His will to be good, and then to patiently wait for Him to

answer. God gives us a gracious gift of answered prayer! We don't deserve it, but God loves to give gifts to His children! Sometimes, though, God is gracious when He doesn't answer prayer. And that is a difficulty in which we His children greatly struggle. We cry out to God in joy or need, but God our Heavenly Father, in His gracious will, does not give us what we ask. Only through perspective, time, and sometimes continued trust do we gain a measure of understanding the good and gracious will of our heavenly Father in not answering our prayers.

The Gift of Waiting in Prayer

There is another gift God gives us in prayer and that is the waiting. Getting what you ask for and not getting what you ask for is sometimes a gift in itself as you know the Lord's will in the situation. But asking the Lord continually for something and waiting for His answer is sometimes even more difficult. You don't immediately know what the Lord will give you in His gracious will. So, you pray, you wait, and you remind yourself that your heavenly Father is good and gracious, that you are His child in Jesus Christ, and that He knows the very best for you and for others around you. So, you continue in your prayers as you started, in faith in Jesus Christ that you are saved, you are loved, you are a child of God and that He graciously loves you more than you can see.

Thank You for Your Gift of Prayer!

It has been 8 months since I was Called to be your pastor. In those 8 months, we and so many of you have prayed for our house to sell and for us to get a blessing home for our family and congregation. Our family thought that our prayers would be answered quickly, but that was not the Lord's will. We thought that the fall would offer a new opportunity for our house to sell in the Lord's will. But it was only as we took our house off the market to wait out the dry season of the holidays that we received an answer from the Lord that our house would sell and is now under contract. Praise God and thank you so much for your prayers over these last months! I know so many of you prayed diligently for us in this situation and your prayers, in the waiting and God answering, have been a great gift and comfort to our whole family. Thank you!

What is Next?

So, as I'm writing this, our family is going through the process of finding our blessing home trying to keep an eye on our present, future and unseen needs and wants. We are asking the Lord's Spirit to guide us through this next step as well. God willing, we will go under contract with our blessing home right after Thanksgiving so that we can coincide selling and buying our home at the end of December. This will give us the blessing of moving right after Christmas with minimal difficulties. After that, we will be moving all of our stuff from our current home and out of storage to nest in our new blessing home. A lot of you have offered to help, and once we know the situation we will let you know. Until then, please rejoice with us in the waiting, the answered prayer, and the upcoming blessing of our move. And continue to pray as we reach the end of this chapter of our journey with you, our brothers and sisters at Holy Cross.

The Gift that Keeps on Giving

As you have prayed for us and are still praying for us, I would ask that you continue to pray for members of our congregation and our brothers and sisters in Christ around the world. Answered and unanswered prayer as well as the waiting in between is a gift from God that strengthens His children to trust Him in the process of prayer! Please continue to pray for your own families through faith in Christ. Please continue to pray for your brothers and sisters at Holy Cross. Please continue to pray for fellow siblings in our Synod and our relatives in Christ around the world. Please pray for the stranger and your neighbor as God connects you to them. And please pass along your prayer requests to others. The gift of prayer is not only for the person you are praying for but also for you as you rejoice in their answered prayer, as you comfort them in their unanswered prayers, and as you share with them patience while they wait in prayer.

Honduras Special Project

The 2025 Holy Cross Honduras mission team is assembled and already in preparations for our trip next March. We have exciting news to share about this year's special project! Pastor Omar has long had a desire to establish a medical clinic in Lepaterique to serve the community. With help from church partners, Betesda church has been able to secure land and is building a first floor which focuses on physical needs.

The next phase is to build a second floor focused on providing mental health trauma and counseling services. Betesda is asking Holy Cross to partner with them to complete this phase. From Pastor Omar: "The clinic will aim to receive mothers who have suffered from sexual assaults, children who have suffered physical or psychological abuse, children from the middle school and high school who may be exhibiting aggressive behaviors, and to address multiple forms of discrimination. It will also serve as a support for them and provide counseling."

Funds raised this year will go toward this project and additionally to support the churches of Santa Redencion and LCMS Good Shepherd in Tegucigalpa.
