#### **Simplified Stewardship - Evaluate**

2 Corinthians 8:3 <sup>3</sup> For they gave according to their means, as I can testify, and beyond their means, of their own accord.

1 Corinthians 16:1-2 <sup>1</sup>Now concerning the collection for the saints: as I directed the churches of Galatia, so you also are to do. <sup>2</sup> On the first day of every week, each of you is to put something aside and store it up, as he may prosper, so that there will be no collecting when I come.

#### **Simplified Stewardship**

Our 2025 Milestone Statement focuses us on our identity and community in Christ here at Holy Cross. The church leadership and I desire for you all to grow in your identity as a Christian, as a Lutheran, and as members of our congregation. We also want to build stronger church community connections with one another. In short, we want to grow as God's family! One focus area in this theme is growing more as God's stewards here at Holy Cross with all the various gifts of Time, Talent, and Treasure He has given us.

#### **Making Stewardship Easier**

Many Christians don't like to talk about stewardship. Usually, it is because they have been incorrectly taught or improperly motivated about stewardship. This year I would like to simplify Christian stewardship to some very easy habits to make our stewardship more of a joyful response to all that God has given us in His grace.

#### **Evaluate God's Physical Gifts**

Take stock each year of the physical gifts and Treasures that God has given you. What is your yearly income? What increase have you made in your investments? What physical things have you been given or have maintained in your household? These are all great physical gifts, Treasures, that God has generously entrusted to you for use in His Kingdom! God has made you His steward to take care of these things, use them appropriately, and to make Him an increase for His Kingdom.

#### **Yearly Evaluation**

Every year our government forces you to take stock of your Treasures and increase. It does it for an entirely different reason, for us to pay our taxes. However, the principle of yearly evaluation of our gifts from God is a good habit. A good Christian stewardship habit is to evaluate your income and Treasures every year either during the first of the year or in April when you evaluate your earthly taxes. (You can do it at other times,

but these times correspond with how you already evaluate your taxes.) All your income, your assets, and your spending are gifts from God for His Kingdom!

#### **Proportional Church Giving**

It is at this time you can evaluate how you regularly and proportionally give to God through our congregation. It is an easy process to look at what you gave last year, look at how God has blessed you throughout the year, and then set a weekly number of what you will give to our congregation as your proportional giving. You can also evaluate how you can stretch, sacrifice, and grow in this giving in response to all the good gifts God has given us throughout the year.

#### **Made Easy and Effective**

This evaluated proportional giving of our stewardship of treasure helps remove the feelings of guilt that sometimes are incorporated with poor stewardship practices. If you are generously directing your Treasures for God's family, you are more joyful! It also is a first fruits budget so that you can better strategize your other bills and monetary responsibilities. If you set aside Treasures at the first, you are less likely to feel constrained at the last. Finally, it is a very effective way to help your congregation manage its Treasure stewardship. The church's budget, spending, and generosity become easier to manage and operate.

#### More Simplified Stewardship to Come

Throughout this year (and possibly beyond), we will be learning more Simplified Stewardship habits as we grow in our identity and community here at Holy Cross. If you have found this small simplified stewardship habit of evaluation beneficial, share it with others and pass it along to your family. Also, if you have other small tips, tricks, or habits that have helped you in your Christian stewardship please pass them along to me and other Christians. We joyfully learn and grow from each other as we are connected here at Holy Cross!

## **Honduras Special Project**

The 2025 Holy Cross Honduras mission team is assembled and already in preparations for our trip next March. We have exciting news to share about this year's special project! Pastor Omar has long had a desire to establish a medical clinic in Lepaterique to serve the community. With help from church partners, Betesda church has been able to secure land and is building a first floor which focuses on physical needs.

The next phase is to build a second floor focused on providing mental health trauma and counseling services. Betesda is asking Holy Cross to partner with them to complete this phase. From Pastor Omar: "The clinic will aim to receive mothers who have suffered from sexual assaults, children who have suffered physical or psychological abuse, children from the middle school and high school who may be exhibiting aggressive behaviors, and to address multiple forms of discrimination. It will also serve as a support for them and provide counseling."

Funds raised this year will go toward this project and additionally to support the churches of Santa Redencion and LCMS Good Shepherd in Tegucigalpa.
