1 Corinthians 16:1-2 Now concerning the collection for the saints: as I directed the churches of Galatia, so you also are to do. 2 On the first day of every week, each of you is to put something aside and store it up, as he may prosper, so that there will be no collecting when I come.

Simplified Stewardship Please read January's Stewardship newsletter article if you have not already. We are learning about our identity and community here at Holy Cross all throughout this year. Stewardship is part of our Christian, Lutheran and Holy Cross identity. God desires of us to be generous, joyful and wise concerning our stewardship of Time, Talent and Treasure.

Making Stewardship Easier Each month I will be writing about a simple "tip" or "trick" you can use concerning your stewardship. Last month the simplified stewardship principle was to Evaluate all the good things the Lord has given you at least once a year, either at the beginning of the year or around tax time. These natural cultural times can help us marvel at what all the Lord has given us this past year!

Regularly Paying Your Treasures In our world today, we have many conveniences to help us pay our earthly bills on time. I do remember a time when my father had to pay all bills once a month or once a week by check. I then learned how to use a checkbook. But then my world changed for the better when I began to start paying my bills online electronically! I no longer had to put a lot of mental energy and time into paying my earthly bills. I could set things up to automatically withdraw money or send money to those that I owed. Paying something like my house mortgage became easier and better for me to track. My creditors also liked that I was paying electronically and regularly so I didn't have fines, fees or missed payments.

Weekly or Monthly Giving It is a good and Godly habit to set aside Treasure (money) for your proportional giving to your local congregation (Holy Cross). Usually, I encourage people to give weekly to their church or, at the least, once a month. This is because if you don't make stewardship of Treasure a first fruit habit, you will always begrudge giving money later on. And if your creditors want their money on time, and this is good earthly stewardship, then God would want you to have a regular timed habit of giving your offerings, tithes or proportional giving for your Treasure stewardship. If you haven't already looked at your Treasure stewardship this year, please see if you can regularly give to Holy Cross once a week if not once a month.

Checks vs. Electronic Giving I want to thank all stewards who give to Holy Cross and those who have faithfully, weekly or monthly, written a check and put it in the offering plate. Your giving back to God in your

stewardship has allowed His ministry to continue at Holy Cross! I would ask you, though, to consider changing the form of offering from writing checks to steady electronic giving. I ask this for a couple of reasons. Firstly, you will find it easier to give every week if it is automatically done. Even when there is 3 feet of snow, you will still be regularly giving in your Treasure stewardship. Secondly, this helps the congregational leadership, and the congregation as a whole, be better stewards as they can better track what offerings come in and what to expect in our budget. As a side note, giving checks in the offering plate can be a physical reminder of stewardship for you or others who see you put them in the offering plate. I recently realized that Holy Cross has around 70% of its regular giving being done by physical check and only 30% by electronic giving. If more members used electronic giving rather than check giving, it would greatly and positively benefit the congregation as a whole. (However, there are other physical ways of putting something in the offering plate when you give electronically so that you, your family and your siblings in Christ can benefit from the physical action of passing the plate. More to come on this later.)

Card vs. Auto Bill Pay Holy Cross has a great avenue of electronic giving to the congregation and to specific areas of need. If you go to our website and use the DONATE tab, you will go to a very easy way for you to regularly give your proportional giving to your congregation. There is one slight "catch," though. When you use this method, there is a 3% fee charged by the card companies to use this service. You are even asked to help pay for this if you are using this service. It is a good form of regular electronic stewardship, but here is a way for you to not pay the 3% to someone else and give that or your original amount directly to church. You can go to your online banking, go to BILL PAY and then have them regularly deduct/pay to Holy Cross every week or month. You not only get the benefit of regular stewardship, but you can increase your giving by 3% if you desire.

More Simplified Stewardship to Come Throughout this year (and possibly beyond), we will be learning more Simplified Stewardship habits as we grow in our identity and community here at Holy Cross. If you have found this small simplified stewardship habit of regularity beneficial, please share it with others and pass it along to your family. Also, if you have other small tips, tricks, or habits that have helped you in your Christian stewardship, please pass them along to me and other Christians. We joyfully learn and grow from each other as we are connected here at Holy Cross!

As many of you know from attending the Annual Voters' Meeting, we start 2025 with a significant <u>budgeted deficit of around \$169,000</u>. That's the bad news. We will be watching the budget closely and in addition to monthly updates here, we will be providing quarterly discussion of actual budget progress throughout the year and any steps taken or recommended to help ease the projected deficit.

Welcome to Carma VanOrman who joins the Board of Directors as a member at large.

We are putting together a committee to help organize events as we look to the **60**th **anniversary celebration** later this year. **If you would like to be on this committee, please see me or any member of the Board of Directors.**

Finally, as we look to 2025, the Board of Directors has the following goals in addition to our regular work:

finalize and approve the new revision to the Employee Handbook; review all church policies; review and recommend any changes to the Constitution and by-laws to be approved by the congregation at the Annual Voter's Meeting.


