Simplified Stewardship Please read the previous newsletter articles to learn more about stewardship.

Making Stewardship Easier Each month I will be writing about a simple "tip" or "trick" you can use concerning your stewardship. This month we will look at our Time stewardship and a simple way to be more connected to God and our church family.

Yearly Calendar I am amazed at how many households don't run on a monthly or yearly calendar. Yes, we have automated devices and programs to help us. But often these things help the individual but don't help the family. In our old home (and soon to be in our new home) we had a family calendar written and seen by all the family on a whiteboard by our kitchen. It contained our life, responsibilities, coordination, and fun. As we prepared our house to sell, we took it down and our family began to feel out of touch with time and not connected with each other. We felt lost because we didn't have a touch point on the times: years, seasons, months, weeks, and days in our household. Time, in our day and age, is now a more precious commodity than money. God wants us to be good stewards of our time in service to Him, our family, our church, and our community.

Yearly Festivals In the Old Testament, God's children were on a strictly commanded timetable. They knew their identity of who they were and what they did based on the day of the year and month. God even required them to keep certain festivals and times so as to remind them of His Grace and to make them more of a light to the nations as they practiced differently than their dark world. There were 3 major festivals that they even had to save up for as the family was expected to go to Jerusalem for them. Then there were church festivals for their community and their family to celebrate. God desired them to be on His timetable for their benefit and for their neighbor's benefit.

Christian Yearly Festivals How many of you have your calendars marked for when Easter, the Resurrection of our Lord, happens this year? How many of you know when Pentecost happens or even on what day of the week Christmas happens? Have you set your family calendar as to when secular festivals happen like Thanksgiving or paid holidays? Do you know specific days of Christian celebration all throughout the year and have them marked on your calendar? I have a simple request. Get out your yearly calendar and mark the Christian festivals of Advent, Christmas, Lent, Easter, and Pentecost (even more if you can!). Then coordinate with your whole family when you are going to worship that day. What special things do you all want to do during that time, and how do you all want to celebrate what God has done for you in Christ during those festivals? All it takes is a calendar that everyone in the family accesses, a highlighted title, and a short description of what you want to do.

Not Required but Best Practice You are not required to do anything for your salvation. That is a fact in your justification by grace through faith in Jesus Christ. However, as a Christian disciple, you oftentimes do what is best practice to follow and witness Christ better. Paul, in our text, even though he was free in the Gospel to "blow off" his traditional festivals, was excited to still celebrate them in Christ Jesus! Treat your stewardship of time as a best Christian practice. Become more of a disciplined disciple as you follow Jesus. Christian festivals are all designed to point us back to Jesus Christ our Lord, and they are a great way for you to witness to your neighbor.

More Simplified Stewardship to Come Throughout this year (and possibly beyond), we will be learning more Simplified Stewardship habits as we grow in our identity and community here at Holy Cross. If you have found this small, simplified stewardship habit of festivals beneficial, please share it with others and pass it along to your family. Also, if you have other small tips, tricks, or habits that have helped you in your Christian stewardship, please pass them along to me and other Christians. We joyfully learn and grow from each other as we are connected here at Holy Cross!


