The Voice of Your Shepherd

Pastor Zillinger

1 Peter 5:1-4 So I exhort the elders among you, as a fellow elder and a witness of the sufferings of Christ, as well as a partaker in the glory that is going to be revealed: shepherd the flock of God that is among you, exercising oversight, not under compulsion, but willingly, as God would have you; not for shameful gain, but eagerly; not domineering over those in your charge, but being examples to the flock. And when the chief Shepherd appears, you will receive the unfading crown of glory."

A Pause to Celebrate

We are taking a small pause from my stewardship series to celebrate. I just celebrated my one-year anniversary as your under-shepherd, your pastor, here at Holy Cross. (I hope you are wanting to celebrate as well!) The Lord has blessed me and my family greatly in your Calling me as your pastor. I pray that you also see the Lord's blessing in this Calling.

Hearing the Voice of Your Pastor

Before I was installed, I sought wisdom from our circuit church pastors, your interim pastor, our circuit visitor, and our District President. One piece of advice that I took to heart was the suggestion for the congregation to hear the voice of their pastor in worship, leading, preaching, and teaching. As your under-shepherd I would be proclaiming the Gospel, the voice of our great Shepherd, Jesus Christ. My preaching would be very Law/Gospel focused with Jesus Christ being the main subject of my sermons following the lectionary. (This is something I always do in every sermon!)

Echoes of the Voice

You might have heard an echo of this advice as I led the Shepherd and Sheep Bible study after Easter last year. You might have also heard this as I have primarily led worship with Liturgists helping in just a few ways. (There are certain parts of the worship service that are led by the Pastor and some that are allowed to be led by Liturgists/Lay Leaders). Then you might also have heard the voice of your pastor in the sanctuary Bible study where we are focusing on what it means to be a Christian/Lutheran in our belief, teaching, confession, and practice of the Creeds. (Baptism will soon be coming!)

Future Reverberation

I am now in the blessing of my second year as your pastor. We will be starting to add some more liturgy that lay leaders can help lead. We will also be continuing to hear what it means to be a Christian/Lutheran as we look at the six chief parts of Christian discipleship found in the Catechism. We will be including some more great Bible study options for Sunday morning. We will continue to focus on our identity and community here at Holy Cross as leadership begins working on our Mission and Vision statements as per your Transition Team document. We will continue our healing process as a congregation for the next few years and I pray that you can hear the voice of your Shepherd, Jesus Christ, in the voice of your pastor

May the Lord bless us and keep us as we continue to hear the voice of Jesus Christ! Pastor Zillinger




