LC-MS Stewardship Definition

Christian stewardship is the free and joyous activity of God's family — the church — in managing all of life's resources for His purposes.

Time, Talent, and Treasure

God has given you all things in Christ Jesus as a gift for His kingdom, for your neighbor, and eventually for your enjoyment. Simplified Stewardship encompasses all of our Time, Talent, and Treasure. All that we do, each day, how we plan, and what we accomplish is all considered our stewardship of time. Our abilities, desires, strengths, weaknesses, and vocations are all considered our stewardship of talent. All of our possessions, our income, our expenses, and our wealth are considered our stewardship of treasure.

Talents

God has made you unique with many abilities and talents that you may use to serve Him and others

well. Some talents are unique only to you, how you do things, and how you are created by God. Other talents might be possessed, utilized, and used by many people. Some talents are developed skills, while others are abilities that come naturally to you. You can excel in some talents, or you can just use them regardless of success or failure. Some talents are available to you over time, while others disappear with time and situation. What you do and how you do things are your talents given to you by God. They are not things you are to hide, squander, or even keep to yourself. They are things that the more you use them, the more they will benefit others and even yourself!

Available

In order to serve others well, you have to be available, with them, to serve them. It is one thing to be good, successful, or efficient in your service. It is another to be available to serve when you are needed. Our Bible verse talks about how you are not to neglect meeting together in worship and church activities because you might miss the opportunity to serve your brother and sister in Christ. Also, in not being available in worship or other church events, you restrict their talents in serving you.

Aware

You also need to be aware of others around you, their situation, and their needs, or even wants, so that you may serve them. Just showing up right on time for church and then leaving right away might not be a good use of your talents in serving others or even allowing them to serve. Just hanging out at church all the time with your head buried in your phone or talking to only your friends might not give you the opportunities to serve that are needed. Be aware of your surroundings, of the saints around you, and even of your neighbor. There are so many opportunities for you to use your talents in service to God and others!

More Simplified Stewardship to Come

Throughout this year (and possibly beyond), we will be learning more Simplified Stewardship habits as we grow in our identity and community here at Holy Cross. If you have found this small, simplified stewardship habit and definition beneficial, please share it with others and pass it along to your family. Also, if you have other small tips, tricks, or habits that have helped you in your Christian stewardship, please pass them along to me and other Christians. Please share this article and tip with others in our congregation, as many have not yet read these newsletter articles or seen the Sunday morning slides. We joyfully learn and grow from and with each other as we are connected here at Holy Cross!

We continue to track closely to the approved budget, some pluses and minuses here and there, but overall fairly close. This is good news in that we are seeing what we planned. But this is also bad news. Recall our approved budget results in an end-of-year deficit of approximately \$169k. This is obviously unsustainable beyond this year. As discussed at the Annual Voter's Meeting, the BODs will use the May financial report (which we receive mid-June) to review possible cuts/potential savings we can still realize this year.

Looking forward to 2026, unless something unforeseen happens and without increased giving, we will be

looking to make substantial cuts to the budget for next year.

In other news, we are looking to revise the constitution and bylaws. I am forming a committee to take on this work and would like to have 3-5 members from the congregation in on this effort, along with representatives from the BOD, BOLM, and staff. If you are interested, please let me know.




